

Erasmus+ Course for Teachers

CLIL for Secondary Teachers

This course introduces Secondary Teachers to the principles of Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL), as an effective way to teach new languages to secondary school students.

COURSE OUTLINE

CLIL for Secondary Teachers is designed to help secondary teachers who face the challenge of teaching their subject in a language that is not their students' mother tongue. It will show how to use CLIL methodology effectively in any secondary school subject area. There is a focus on practical activities which show how to blend content-driven lessons with language learning in the secondary school classroom.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Overall objectives of the mobility. Provide an overview of the principles of CLIL teaching and your role in it as a teacher. Address the difficulties in implementing CLIL in your given teaching context. Analyse a teaching methodology which will allow you to integrate subject and language learning. Provide guidance on how to select subject material and tasks to work on in your lessons. Focus on actual activities and practices you can implement in your classroom.

Added value of the mobility. The course helps participants to have the confidence to implement the principles of CLIL into their teaching practice, while practicing English and sharing experiences with fellow secondary teachers.

Activities to be carried out. Interactive teaching with input sessions, individual and group work. Skills focused workshops to develop your own teaching materials. Feedback sessions in which participants reflect on their own practice, while also sharing their own knowledge and skills. Participants are directed towards online resources to further develop their understanding of CLIL. Cultural and heritage trips as part of a chaperoned group.

Expected outcomes and impact. This course provides a professional development opportunity which will help participants to feel more confident about applying CLIL strategies in their classrooms. Through project-based activities and workshops, participants will acquire useful tips and insights and will also benefit from knowledge and skills shared by fellow participants. The opportunity to experience new cultural contexts and network with international colleagues is a further positive outcome.

CULTURAL PROGRAMME

The courses are delivered in Atlantic Language School in Galway on Ireland's 'Wild Atlantic' Coast, and participants will have ample opportunity to learn about the cultural heritage of both Ireland and the local area. The week-long programme includes a full-day cultural tour to a local area of scenic and heritage value, a guided historical walking tour of Galway city, and afternoon social and cultural activities.
