Overall Objectives of the Mobility	Participants will improve communicative and written competence in English by compliing an intensive course delivered by expert trainers in an EFL context, with tangit development of skills and confidence.		
Added Value of the Mobility	The course equips participants to build confidence in their writing abilities so that their work may be published and understood internationally. It will also allow participants to build competence and confidence as speakers when presenting their work.

Expected Outcomes and Impact	The course provides a professional development opportunity for participants whi provides practice and tangible improvement in skills they will apply when writing in a academic context. The courses are tailored for activities typical in Higher Education institutions and a dissemination activity is inbuilt to allow participants to share the knowledge and skills acquired on the course with colleagues. Cultural familiarisation with an international setting and an emphasis on promoting ongoing sharing of knowledge edge and skills are further aspects for beyond the course.
